This August 17, 1992, Time magazine cover (on the right) showing an emaciated Muslim (with his shirt in hand, seemingly smiling for the photographer, and with many standing around him who were apparently not as emaciated) helped to stimulate debate and

comparisons between what was happening in Serb detention camps in the War in Bosnia and the Nazi concentration camps (*above left*) in World War II.



Serb prison camps were described as "hell on earth" by Dr. Bernard Kouchner, a French minister for humanitarian affairs and the leader of a delegation to inspect them. Others reported that there were Serb-run rape-death camps.

The response of those defending the Serbs regarding any similarities between Nazi death camps and the Serb camps is that the Serbs were not involved in any systematic annihilation, and that similar methods to aid ethnic cleansing of certain geographic areas were used by Croats and Muslims, though perhaps to a lesser degree.

Key Understanding: *Bosnian reminders of the pale horse carrying death, with hell following.* The detention camps in the 1992-1995 War in Bosnia, which reminded the world of the Nazi death camps in World War II, served to further *prophetically* link the War in Bosnia with the theme of the Pale Horse and its rider Death, with Hell following.

Revelation 6:8 (KJV) <u>And I looked, and behold A PALE HORSE: and his name that</u> <u>sat on him was DEATH, AND HELL followed with him</u>.
