


#858 Why Abraham Lincoln was named Abraham – Article 16 of the Augsburg Confession and the Commander-in-Chief of the Union forces, the 16th President of the United States, go together – at Gettysburg

Key Understanding: Article $\underline{16}$ of the Augsburg Confession and the $\underline{16}^{th}$ President of the United States go together – at Gettysburg.



The Augsburg Confession, including its spirit of "just war" in Article <u>16</u>, was a foundation of the Gettysburg Lutheran Seminary, the first on the North American continent. That is why the Lord brought the greatest battle in the history of the New World to the seminary, the July 1-3, 1863, Battle of

Gettysburg. The commander-inchief of the Union forces was the <u>16</u>th President



of the United States, Abraham Lincoln. Lincoln would soon deliver his famous Gettysburg Address at the Gettysburg Cemetery on November 19, 1863. His "new birth of freedom" for the nation was reflecting the spiritual theme of the birth of the children of Ishmael. Ishmael's birth is seen in Genesis 16:16.
