

Key Understanding: Reviewing how and why the Soviet Union is tied to the letter to the church in Philadelphia. Unsealing #458 pulled together (a) Revelation 3:10, a part of the letter to the church in Philadelphia, with (b) Daniel 12:10 through the double Thomas Paines, one Thomas Paine associated with America's defeat of Great Britain in the Revolutionary War, and the other Thomas Paine associated with America's defeat of the Soviet Union in the 'space race' Cold War. The Revolutionary War's Thomas Paine's famous written words, "These are the times that try men's souls," were a fulfillment of Revelation 3:10, only in the opposite context than was meant by Thomas Paine.

Revelation 3:7, 10 (KJV) And to the angel of the <u>CHURCH IN PHILADELPHIA</u> write; These things saith he that is holy, he that is true, he that hath the key of David, he that openeth, and no man shutteth; and shutteth, and no man openeth;

<u>THE HOUR OF TEMPTATION</u>, which shall come upon all the world, <u>TO TRY THEM</u>
