
#2526 The Yom Kippur War and the Abomination of Desolation – The post-World War II U.S. waxing great toward the South and toward the East as a *second* Syria/Antiochus IV Epiphanes, part 785, Green Jews, (i), Israel rebirthed on May 14-15, 1948, in a manner envisioned by the prophets of Israel?

We are moving from <u>Smyrna Jews</u> to <u>Green Jews</u>. A part of the story of <u>Green Jews</u> is that the birth name of **David Ben-Gurion**, the first Prime Minister of Israel, was *David Green*. David Ben-Gurion was named one of Time Magazine's 100 most important people of the 20th Century.

The establishment of Israel. At midnight on May 14-15, 1948, the Provisional Government of Israel proclaimed the new State of Israel. On that same date (May 15, 1948) the United States, through President Truman, recognized the provisional Jewish government as the de facto authority of the new Jewish state. Earlier in the day, on May 14, 1948, the Jewish People's Council gathered at the Tel Aviv Museum and approved the proclamation of the Declaration of the Establishment of the State of Israel, establishing the State of Israel.




David Ben-Gurion was the Prime Minister of Israel when it was founded on May 14-15, 1948

One sentence of the declaration states:

THE STATE OF ISRAEL will be open for Jewish immigration and for the Ingathering of the Exiles; it will foster the development of the country for the benefit of all its inhabitants; it will be based on freedom, justice and peace as envisaged by the prophets of Israel; it will ensure complete equality of social and political rights to all its inhabitants irrespective of religion, race or sex; it will guarantee freedom of religion, conscience, language, education and culture; it will safeguard the Holy Places of all religions; and it will be faithful to the principles of the Charter of the United Nations.

Here is #2526–Doc 1, the Declaration of the Establishment of the State of Israel from the Israel Ministry of Foreign Affairs. It includes the *above* paragraph, about two-thirds of the way through the declaration.

Key Understanding: *Establishing Israel in fulfillment of the millennial visions of the prophets*. The issue is whether the establishment of the State of Israel on May 14-15, 1948, was based on freedom, justice, and peace as envisaged by the prophets of Israel, as is stated in the Declaration of the Establishment of the State of Israel. It wasn't. The peace envisioned by the prophets of Israel is speaking of the peace established upon the return and reign of the Messiah, such as is seen in Isaiah 9:6-7.

Isaiah 9:6-7 (KJV) For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given [the first part of this verse has to do with the First Coming of the Son of God, Jesus Christ]: and THE GOVERNMENT SHALL BE UPON HIS SHOULDER [and this part of the verse has to do with the Second Coming of the Son of God, Jesus Christ]: and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counsellor, The mighty God, The everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace.

7 Of the increase of his government and peace there shall be no end, upon the throne of David, and upon his kingdom, to order it, and to establish it with judgment and with justice from henceforth even for ever. The zeal of the LORD of hosts will perform this.
