part 875, The Palm Christians, (vi), Striking Jesus with the Palms of their Hands

Revelation 7:9-10 (KJV) After this I beheld, and, lo, <u>a</u> great multitude, which no man could number, of all nations, and kindreds, and people, and tongues, stood before the throne, and before the Lamb, clothed with white robes, AND PALMS IN THEIR HANDS;

10 And cried with a loud voice, saying, Salvation to our God which sitteth upon the throne, and unto the Lamb.

Key Understanding #1: *Palm Sunday*. The <u>first</u> theme surrounding *palms* and *hands* appears in John 12:12-15.

John 12:12-15 (KJV) On the next day <u>much people</u> that were come to the feast, when they heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem,

13 <u>TOOK BRANCHES OF PALM TREES</u>, and went forth to meet him, and cried, Hosanna: Blessed is the King of Israel that cometh in the name of the Lord.

14 And Jesus, when he had found a young ass, sat thereon; as it is written, 15 Fear not, daughter of Sion: behold, thy King cometh, sitting on an ass's colt.

Key Understanding #2: Striking Jesus with the palms of their hands. A <u>second</u> theme surrounding <u>palms</u> and <u>hands</u> appears in Mark 14:63-65 (KJV).

Mark 14:63-65 (KJV) Then the high priest [Caiaphas] rent his clothes, and saith, What need we any further witnesses?

64 Ye have heard the blasphemy: what think ye? And they all condemned him to be guilty of death.

65 <u>AND SOME BEGAN TO</u> <u>SPIT ON HIM</u>, and to cover his face, and to buffet him,
