part 879, The Palm Christians, (x), The 'palms in their hands' Christians of Revelation 7:9 are "a great multitude" of 'Feast of Booths' and 'Palm Sunday' Christians

John 12:12-15 (KJV) On the next day much people that were come to the feast, when they heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem, 13 TOOK BRANCHES OF PALM TREES, and went forth to meet him, and cried, Hosanna: Blessed is the King of Israel that cometh in the name of the Lord. 14 And Jesus, when he had found a young ass, sat thereon; as it is written, 15 Fear not, daughter of Sion: behold, thy King cometh, sitting on an ass's colt.

Key Understanding #1: Palm branches and the Feast of Booths and the deliverance of the Jews from the bondage of the Egyptians by Moses pointed to palm branches and Palm Sunday and the deliverance of the Jews from the bondage of the Romans by Jesus Christ.





Revelation 7:9-10 (KJV) After this I beheld, and, lo, <u>a great multitude</u>, which no man could number, of all nations, and kindreds, and people, and tongues, stood before the throne, and before the Lamb, clothed with white robes, <u>AND PALMS IN THEIR</u> HANDS;

10 And cried with a loud voice, saying, Salvation to our God which sitteth upon the throne, and unto the Lamb. Key Understanding #2: Likewise, the 'palms in their hands' Christians of Revelation 7:9 represent "a great multitude" whose hearts are set on a 'Feast of Booths' and 'Palm Sunday' Christianity that misses the cross of the believer and emphasizes the kingship of Jesus Christ (and the believer) and Christianity's deliverance of mankind from physical and political bondage.

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
