By early 1787, Edward Gibbon was "straining for the goal" of finishing *The Decline and Fall of the Roman Empire*, and with great relief the project was completed in June:

"It was on the . . . night of the 27th of June, 1787, between the hours of eleven and twelve, that I wrote the last lines of the last page in a summer-house in my garden . . . I will not dissemble the first emotions of joy on the recovery of my freedom; and perhaps the establishment of my fame. But my pride was soon humbled, and a sober melancholy was spread over my mind by the idea that I had taken my everlasting leave of an old and agreeable friend."

The Decline and Fall of the Roman Empire was completed on June 27, 1787

Key Understanding: July 8, 1776 – 11 years less 11 days – June 27, 1787. Remarkably, Edward Gibbon describes finally completing his massive work, The Decline and Fall of the Roman Empire, between 11 p.m. and midnight on June 27, 1787, exactly 11 years (less 11 days) after the July 8, 1776, "mouth speaking great things" rise of the United States of America out of the Roman Empire that was in fulfillment of Daniel 7:8.
